Lunchtimes and Afternoons

You are welcome to wander around the stalls or eat your lunch during the performances. If you have not brought lunch with you, food and drink can be bought from the refreshment stall. If you wish to make a purchase from other stalls or buy tickets for future concerts please see a steward. These concerts are free of charge excepting for Wednesday afternoon, when there is a sing a-long film presentation of "The Sound of Music at 2.30.pm and a nominal charge of £2.

Evenings

Your advance purchased ticket includes a drink either during the interval or after the performance. Hot drinks are being served at the front of the Church, cold drinks at the back. You are welcome to wander around the stalls before and after the performance, or during the interval. If you wish to make a purchase or buy tickets for future concerts please see a steward. Admission to evening concerts is £5.

Friday Afternoon

Traditional afternoon teas will be served at the Tea Dance in the hall from 2.pm to 4.pm.

Saturday Lunchtime

St George's Church Carnival Summer Fête is taking place during the lunchtime performance of "Sounds of Steel". Refreshments are available at the Summer Fête; teas and coffees in the hall, and a reasonably priced Barbecue lunch in the church grounds.

Saturday Evening

Your ticket includes one drink from the bar - beer, wine or soft drinks. You are welcome to use the licensed bar for subsequent drinks. Under licensing regulations only drink purchased at the Festival Bar may be consumed on Church premises - inside or outside. You must be over 18 to buy alcoholic drinks from the bar. You are invited to bring a picnic to enjoy in the church grounds from 6.pm which is when the bar will open. Also bring a rug or chair to sit on.

Waterlooville 2008

The Waterlooville Music Festival takes place at St George's Church during the second complete week of June each year. The Festival is now into its third year, and is firmly established as one of the leading cultural and musical events in East Hampshire. Next year's festival will be from 13th to 21st June 2009.

The Festival has developed an excellent reputation for attracting performances of the very best local talent. The Committee is now dealing with enquiries from highly regarded and talented performers keen to take part in the 2009 season. Audiences will be impressed by the high standard that will be presented throughout the 2008 Festival season.

Lunchtime and Afternoon concerts are free of charge. Donations towards the cost of staging these concerts will be greatly appreciated. Lunches will be served each day at reasonable prices. On the Wednesday there is an afternoon sing a-long film showing of The Sound of Music (£2 admission). On the Friday there is a tea dance during the afternoon with traditional afternoon teas available for purchase. On the Saturday the Festival takes place during St George's Church Summer Fête. Evening concerts are £5, which for advance ticket holders includes a free interval drink (wine, soft drink or tea/coffee).

For "Last Night of the Proms" on Saturday 14th June there is a licensed bar selling real ale and wine. The free interval drink includes the choice of 1 pint of real ale. Tickets for this concert are sold out. A Season Ticket for all concerts except Last Night at the Proms is priced at £20. (Seven concerts for the price of four).

Waterlooville 2008

This year, the Waterlooville Music Festival starts off on the Saturday with *Market Place Music*, musical performances throughout the town centre, including in the church where there will be a performance by concert pianist **Bohuslav Sosna**. In the evening we have an orchestral concert when we welcome the **Fareham and Gosport Youth Orchestra**.

The 'Scratch' choir this year will be performing Music from Les Miserables and other great west end musicals, under the direction of **Rod Starr**, Musical Director of the Portsmouth Chorus. Great entertainment, an evening of well known music. Monday sees the return of **Nadina String Quartet** featuring *The Making of a Violin*. This promises to be an especially interesting and delightful event.

Tuesday evening brings the Havant Clarinet and Saxophone Choir to the Festival. The junior choir - HCSC2 - was a great success in 2006 and we are delighted to be welcoming the senior band to this year's programme. On the same evening HCSC is followed by the award winning **A Choired Taste**. Two other highly renowned and long-established choirs feature on this year's programme - on Wednesday we have Solent Male Voice Choir, and on Friday the Hampshire Police Male Voice Choir. Wednesday evening also brings the exciting African Caribbean and Negro Spiritual music of Africapella. Thursday evening is a real treat with the return of **Hampshire** Guitar Orchestra who were such a hit at the 2006 Festival when they shared the evening concert. This year they are back for a full evening of entertaining music that will delight all tastes. Meanwhile the lunchtimes and afternoons have a full schedule, with concerts from a variety of local schools, Jess Spurgeon presenting a Flute Recital, Sue Palmer with an Organ Workshop and recital, and Noah Africa Music drumming concert. Friday lunchtime features an organ recital by Stephen Binnington, Director of the Farrington Music School, Shaftesbury. Steven has presented organ recitals at many wellknown venues throughout the UK, and is also highly regarded as a conductor and composer. His repertoire will including the rousing and famous J S Bach masterpiece Toccata & Fugue in D Minor. Afternoon events include a sing-along screening of The Sound of Music and a Tea Dance accompanied by traditional afternoon tea.

And once again we close the festival week with **Last Night of the Proms**. We will be recapturing the magic of the real event with flag waving and Land of Hope and Glory, but making this extra special is a guest appearance of **Zoë Mace**, a young classical singer and rising star. In a few years time when she's really famous you can say you have seen her!

Bohuslav SosnaInternational Concert Pianist

Bohnuslav Sosna was born in Nitra, Slovakia, and comes from a musical family. He began playing the piano at the age of 8 and studied at the Music Conservatory in Topolcany, Slovakia, later graduating from the University of Constantine the Philospher in Nitra. During his studies he won numerous prizes and awards both within Slovakia and Internationally. He was the first interpreter of Ivan Parik's work *Theree songs for the piano* and his performance of this piece at the *Hommage and Park* concert in April 2006 was broadcast by Slovak national radio.



In 2007 he moved to the UK and is currently preparing for the advanced LRSM under Assistant Professor of Music Valentina Seferinova.

This lunchtime concert will consist of the following pieces:

We are delighted to be welcoming the renowned Hampshire Police Choir for their first appearance at the Waterlooville Music Festival.

The Choir originated in Portsmouth during the Second World War and was soon in great demand raising morale and fund raising for restoration of the heavily bombed city. Many concerts were given with the Band of the Royal Marines, and the Choir featured in BBC radio broadcasts, and after the war with radio appearances on "Friday Night is Music Night". In 1967 the Choir took on its present name and since then its size has remained around 60 members, all serving or retired police officers and others associated with the force. The Choir has performed at numerous notable venues during its distinguished history, including The Royal Albert Hall, Cardiff Arms Park and the VE Celebrations in Hyde Park before the Royal Family, Heads of State and an audience of around 200,000. For 21 years the choir was conducted by Trevor Ibbotson, but in 1997 the choir appointed its first female Musical Director, Mrs Terri Freeman LRAM, LTCL, ISM. In the past ten years under their new conductor the choir has continued to grow and now has an expanded repertoire covering many genres including songs from the musicals, classical works and popular music from the past. The choir has sung at exciting new venues such as Romsey Abbey, Winchester Cathedral, Portsmouth Anglican Cathedral together with a special invitation to take part in the BBC 'Songs of Praise' programme for Remembrance Day. In October 2008 the Choir will be taking part in the 21st Festival of Male Voices at the Royal Albert Hall, London.
