Welcome from the Chairman....

Welcome to Waterlooville Music Festival 2015 - celebrating our tenth year. The aim of this week is to bring music into St. George's Church and into the centre of Waterlooville, for the whole community to enjoy. This year is no exception. Together with Waterlooville Business Association's "Market Place Music" on the first day of the Festival, you are invited to over 50 concerts, featuring soloists, choirs, instrumental groups and orchestras. It's really good that once again local schools are taking part in the Festival. Students are performing at lunchtimes and in the afternoons and children are invited to a recorder workshop and the ever popular workshop featuring the African Drums. To celebrate our tenth year the festival opens with a gala concert featuring the nationally renowned **Royal Marines Association Concert Band**. On Sunday the **Festival Scratch Choir** are joined by **Wyndcliffe Voices** with some beautiful vocal classics. The vocal theme continues on Monday with **AChaired Taste** and South African spirituals from **Kopanang** who were such a hit at the festival a couple of years ago. On Tuesday it's a traditional brass band in the form of **Denmead Brass** and then we change to a carabret style layout with table and chairs, and dance floor ready for Wednesday's **Folk & Ale Night** featuring the footstomping celtic music of **Revel Weird and Wild** who are joined by **Portsmouth Shantymen**. Thursday bring the much demanded return of the always hugely entertaining **Hampshire Guitar Orchestra** joined by **Havant Clarinet and Saxophone Choir**. Friday is sixties party night provided by **Out of the Shadows**. And of course the festival concludes as ever with **Last Night of the Proms** which I'm afraid was sold out since mid-April but if you have missed out on this then the first Saturday with the Royal Marines is on the programme as an excellent alternative. Throughout the week refreshments will be served and each evening, except Sunday, there'll be a real ale bar supported by one of our local breweries, Bowman's.

Tickets for all the evening concerts are set at very reasonable prices and, with exception of Saturdays, include an interval drink from the bar. But remember that the festival is on all day, and there are many daytime events of a professional standard to enjoy, all of which are free of charge. An important aspect of the festival is that it gives the rare opportunity for students of local schools to show their musical talents to a public audience, and many of our schools will be presenting concerts during the festival week. Other daytime highlights are the lunchtime drumming workshop by **Noah** on Monday, which gives anyone the opportunity to learn and to play the African drums... on Tuesday lunchtime **Oaklands School** will be with us, this concert always brings a remarkable standard of talent and is not to be missed. On Wednesday morning over coffee we have a true professional in the multi-instrumentalist **Robbie Rich** with melodic jazz and that is followed at lunchtime by another professional standard concert by **Gordon Egerton** on clarinet and **Margaret Lloyd** on piano. This is a rare opportunity to enjoy any of these performers in a free concert! Thursday is special as it marks the 200th anniversary, to the day, of the town of Waterlooville, being the date of the Battle of Waterloo (1815). To mark this occasion, the festival has organised a performance from **HMS Nelson Saxophone Quartet** who will be in Waterlooville Precinct from 10am to 11.30am. Mid-morning there will be a ceremony unveiling a Waterloo 200 plaque by the clock.

After this, please be sure to return to St George's Church for the lunchtime concert that will be given on the newly restored organ by **David Cain** a very well know local organist and secretary of Portsmouth and District Organists Association.

On Friday, the morning and lunchtime concerts are provided by **Bourne Community College** under the direction of Don Lloyd who also directs our Last Night of the Proms - so you can be sure of a high standard as ever from his students... and this is followed in the afternoon by the treat of our Palm Court Tea Dance, with real Cornish cream teas available to purchase from the refreshment team.

Saturday 20th lunchtime brings the talent of local rock bands with **Bands on the Lawn** and again there is an exciting line up of free entertainment planned to mark the Festival's tenth anniversary.

The Festival Organisers are greatly indebted to local businesses and councils for their continued support, without which Waterlooville Music Festival could not continue. The individual sponsors are listed at the end of this programme, but special appreciation is given to Allmobility of Waterlooville, Key's Newsagents of Highfield Parade and Thistle Wool Shop in Cowplain all of which have hosted the Festival Ticket Offices. Please support them and the other sponsors whenever possible. As usual Havant Borough Council has been a great supporter of Waterlooville Music Festival and the organisers express their appreciation. Stay Local and Postcode Publications have donated free advertising space which the festival could not otherwise have begun to afford, and we are grateful.

Thank you for coming to this year's Waterlooville Music Festival. All the monies taken during the week go towards the cost of staging the Festival - both this year and next. In 2016 the Festival will be June 11th -19th and the programme is already being compiled. 

In 2011 he led a show band entertaining troops in Helmand Province, Kandahar and Kabul. Tony became known as an experienced Royal Marines arranger, arranging music for many Royal Marines Massed Bands Concerts in the Royal Albert Hall.

Philip Drew will be directing the Wyndcliffe Voices and Festival Scratch Choir. He has given organ recitals and accompanied choirs and choral societies in many venues in South Wales and Southern England. As well as being Musical Director of the Wyndcliffe Voices he is also conductor of the choir Cantores Vagantes. Philip is also a prolific composer, having written some 130 pieces and received over 200 performances,

in Normandy and Louisiana as well as in Britain. Two percussion pieces for the London College of Music grade exams have been published by Stainer and Bell and 13 of his works are published on the Sibelius Music website. Philip last presided over the Festival Scratch Choir at the 2010 Waterlooville Music Festival.



Richard Barnes is distinguished organist for this performance. he gained his early musical training as a Chorister at Westminster Abbey and a Choral Scholar at King's College, Cambridge, where he graduated with an honours degree in music. He had already obtained his Diploma from the Royal College of Organists before leaving school and was later awarded first prize in their Choir Training Diploma examinations.

For some years he was Organist successively at Holy Trinity, Brompton and Dorchester Abbey. He has given recitals and accompanied services and concerts at Westminster Abbey, St Paul's and other cathedrals in England and abroad.

He has also enjoyed a varied career as singer, choral conductor, accompanist and lecturer, being for some years Director of the Renaissance Singers of London and a Professor at the Royal Academy of Music.

Richard is much in demand internationally as a continuo player, and since 1995 has been accompanist to the Chichester Singers with whom he has toured all over Europe and whom he has accompanied on their CD.

Out of the Shadows is a Surrey based band who love playing the music of the Sixties. 
