The aim of this week is to bring music into St. George's Church and into the centre of Waterlooville, for the whole community to enjoy. This year is no exception. Together with Waterlooville Business Association's Market Place Music" on the first day of the Festival, you are invited to over 50 concerts, featuring soloists, choirs, instrumental groups and whole bands.

It's really good that once again local schools are taking part in the Festival. Students are performing at lunchtimes and in the afternoons and classes are coming to the special school workshops featuring hand bell ringing and a morning devoted to recorder instruction. Among the eight days of music the Festival welcomes for the first time this year The Choir Company and Il Campane as well as welcoming back the Hampshire Police Band and AChoired Taste. On the first Saturday a choir comprising children from a number of local schools is performing - **Voices United.** It's particularly good to welcome the children back as the choir is sponsored by Waterlooville Music Festival as part of its aim to encourage music among young people. Two completely new events this year are Saturday's **Dragon Jazz Club** with two jazz bands playing and Friday's Folk and Ale evening featuring Threepenny Bit and **Portsmouth Shanty Men**. On both evenings there'll be a real ale bar supported by one of the local breweries, Bowman's.

The Festival Organisers are greatly indebted to local businesses and councils for their continued support, without which Waterlooville Music Festival could not continue. The individual sponsors are listed at the end of this programme, but special appreciation is given to Allmobility of Waterlooville and Keys News of Highfield Parade. He has also worked with Spike Edney (5th

Always tuneful, Robbie uses the best equipment (Bose speakers) blows a pair of Conn saxophones, silver Yamaha flute and an oldle English

Artley clarinet. He never arrives at a gig with less than a thousand songs at his disposal. And most importantly – for any sax player – he wears a hat!












The Scratch Choir is directed by **Brian Moles**, Director of Music at St Mary's Portsea. Brian is a freelance music teacher, performer and composer.

Hampshire Police Band has been a major highlight at Waterlooville Music Festival before, and we are delighted to be welcoming this hugely accomplished and popular band to the festival once again this year.

Established in 1895, and now one of the few remaining police bands in the country, the Band of the Hampshire Constabulary is based at the Police Training Headquarters at Netley, Southampton. Its members are drawn from serving and retired staff of the Force, both police, support and from family members of the same. The band also welcomes players from outside the Force family where additional instrumentation is needed.

All the band members are volunteers and the band largely operates within its own resources. It is a military-style concert band consisting of woodwind, brass and percussion players. Its wide repertoire ranges over marches and overtures through classical pieces to selections from popular shows.

FOLK AND ALE NIGHT

Hampshire's Leading Folk and Ceilidh Band

THREEPENNY BIT



A young and vibrant addition to the folk scene, Threepenny Bit folk and ceilidh band was formed from an unlikely combination of student-types in Southampton in 2010. Consisting of suitcase percussion, fiddle, flute, guitar and clarinet, they play a wide range of Irish, English, Cornish, Breton and Scottish diddly-dee music with a hint of klezmer! Threepenny Bit set the trend for "Half Price Busking" in the Summer of 2011, when they embarked upon a busking campaign to

at the Winchester Hat Fair, St Mary Bourne Festival, Sidmouth Folk Festival and obtaining a busking license for Covent Garden. Threepenny Bit recorded their debut

album, Something, late 2011, and have just released their second album Cartography.

PORTSMOUTH SHANTY MEN

The Portsmouth Shanty Men formed in 1978, at the request of the organisers of Christchurch Folk Festival after which it disbanded. A few years later the folk world had started to take a renewed interest in shanties, with artists such as Johnny Collins and Jim Mageean leading the way, and the Portsmouth Shanty Men were asked to reform for a concert of maritime music aboard ship, in this case the hulk of H.M.S. Foudrouyant in Portsmouth Harbour. Since that time, Britain has woken up to its proud Maritime Heritage and shanty singing is now seen as an integral part of any Maritime, as well as Folk Festival. They have appeared at Liverpool, Bristol, Swansea, Lancaster, Hull, Carrickfergus in Northern Ireland and Brest in Brittany as well as many folk festivals and folk clubs.
